

Building a Healthy Temple

In the Bible, temples are not just made of brick and mortar, they are also made of flesh and blood. The Apostle Paul tells the Corinthians that their physical bodies are "temples of the Holy Spirit" and calls them to "honor God with your bodies" (1 Corinthians 6:19-20).

You see, the Corinthians had a faulty "dualistic theology," where they believed that only the immortal soul mattered to God, and the mortal physical body was of no ultimate consequence. They had therefore concluded that they could indulge the body with pleasure, gluttony, and immoral actions, since the body would just rot in the grave while the soul soared off to be with God.

But Paul differed. Paul said that the body is sacred to God and should be treated with care and self-respect. The body is the dwelling place of the Holy Spirit. The body belongs to God. The implications are significant.

This fall we will be unfolding a ministry called *Building a Healthy Temple*. It's supported by a Foundation administered by UTSA, who "trains the trainers" to implement the program at NHUMC. We will hear messages about holistic health – mind, body, and spirit. We will have a Bible study on Wednesday evenings beginning September 14 and focusing on what the Bible teaches us about living a healthy life. There will be a nutrition teaching component, where we can learn more about a healthy diet. An activity component will encourage us to take better care of our bodies through exercise and physical activity.

We can't control every aspect of our health, but we can all do better at nurturing a healthy body, a healthy mind, healthy emotions, and a healthy soul.

I hope you'll consider joining in on some or all of the components of this important ministry. The better care we take of our whole selves, the better we will feel, and the better we will be able to serve our Lord and glorify him with our lives.

Health is a good thing to pursue. Let's find out together how we can improve it.
